
**18-WEEK PROGRAM**

When they complete this program, students will have read through 36 easy reading stories, increasing their decoding and reading fluency skills.

For students who are reading short paragraphs with some assistance. Students will read fun, vocabulary-controlled stories, play games, and develop their spelling and vocabulary skills.

When they complete this program, students will have read through 36 easy reading stories to increase fluency skills.

For students who ready to read, or just reading short chapter books. They will progress throughout the year to be ready to read any middle grade book.

When they complete this program, students will have gained reading comprehension and reading speed to become fluent readers.

## NOTES

#### Your First Week |

#### Spelling |

**IMPORTANT NOTE:** This portion of the program is optional. You can choose to use it or not. Spelling will begin next week. Each week's spelling words will be taken directly from the lesson you are working on in "Pine Nut Park Phonics Pages" or from the "Romp in Pine Nut Park Readers."

Also if you choose to use the spelling portion of the program, the weekly spelling test is optional as well. It isn't required for students at this age to have weekly spelling tests. You can choose to complete the spelling practice but opt. out of the spelling test for your student.

For those that do the weekly spelling test, you'll find the pages to complete the tests in Appendix 5 of this guide.

#### Other Activity |
