


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# No Ink Left

"Thanks," Acorn laughed. "But I'm not going to eat it. I'm going to try to make ink with it."


"Ink?" Bandit asked. "How could any critter make ink out of that?"



"We could use your help, Doctor Derby, but we'll have to wait. This stuff has to boil for a while first," Acorn said.


Doctor Derby and the critters began to take turns playing checkers. A couple of hours later the walnut ink was ready.

"Hello," Tatty said and coughed. It was tough running through the deep, damp snow. The raccoons said hello. "What are you three doing today?"


"We're going to Silver Lake," Buster said.


# A Christmas Play

Bristle cleared his throat. "Well, you can shiver as much as you want," he finished.


